



The Cooperative Advantage

When it comes to making economic and charitable contributions to their communities, the nation's more than 40,000 cooperative businesses are industry leaders, setting the bar high for other types of businesses. Being owned largely by people who live and work in the communities they serve gives cooperatives a different perspective from businesses owned by distant investors.

These co-ops are motivated to serve their members not outside investors. Nationwide these 40,000 cooperative businesses are sometimes an overlooked but thriving economic sector. Co-ops come in all shapes and sizes, and they operate in virtually every industry and range in size from small storefronts to Fortune 500 companies.

From the agricultural standpoint, nearly 3,000 farmer cooperatives account for 300,000 jobs nationwide and a total payroll of more than \$8 billion. Some of the well-known farmer cooperatives include SunKist, Land O'Lakes, CHS (Cenex Harvest States), Farm Credit Services of America, and AGP.

In Nebraska, farmer-owned cooperatives also contribute heavily to the economy of our state. For instance:

54 local supply/marketing co-ops operating:	\$6.6 billion total sales of local supply/marketing co-ops
54 headquarter locations	\$2.5 billion total assets of co-ops
359 branch locations in Nebraska	\$211.2 million employee payroll (w/ benefits)
26 branch locations out of state	\$180.3 million net savings generated by local co-ops
9 regional co-ops operating in Nebraska	\$91.3 million investment in new equipment and facilities in past year
5,000+ cooperative employees (full and part-time)	\$82.2 million patronage refunds in past year
66,000+ total voting members of co-ops	\$10.8 million equity/estate redemptions in past year

As you can see, cooperatives in Nebraska are vital to our economy. There are many outstanding career opportunities for young people wishing to pursue a career in the rural portions of our state. FOR THE 2010-11 ACADEMIC YEAR...

- Up to five \$950 scholarships to students at the UNL College of Agricultural Sciences & Natural Resources (CASNR). One scholarship will be awarded to an incoming student and the balance to upperclass students.
- One \$650 scholarship to a student at the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture (NCTA) at Curtis.
- One \$650 scholarship to an upperclass student at Chadron State College.

UNL STUDENTS:

- Must be accepted as a student in CASNR majoring in agricultural business or agricultural economics
- Upperclass students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above
- Incoming students must have demonstrated academic excellence as determined by UNL from SAT/ACT scores

NCTA STUDENT:

- Must be first- or second-year students majoring in business/management or ag production systems with the business option
- Second-year students must have achieved a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above
- First-year students must have demonstrated academic excellence as determined by NCTA from SAT/ACT scores

CHADRON STATE STUDENT:

- Must have achieved sophomore, junior or senior class standing with a major or minor in agribusiness
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above

SELECTION...

Scholarship Committees at the institutions will select recipients based on criteria established for each scholarship.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS...

Scholarships will be awarded to sons/daughters of a parent/legal guardian who has been an active member, director, or employee for at least the prior three (3) years of a cooperative which has been a member in good standing of the Council for the past five (5) years. Scholarship(s) will be awarded without regard to race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or disability.
