## Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation Awards Seven Scholarships

Lincoln, NE (June 22, 2016) – The Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation has awarded seven scholarships totaling \$16,500 for the 2016/17 academic year to students at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) College of Agricultural Sciences & Natural Resources and the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture (NCTA) at Curtis.

The scholarship program was initiated for the 1993/94 academic year with funding from voluntary contributions from the agricultural cooperatives which are members of the Nebraska Cooperative Council. Since the program's inception, 173 scholarships totaling \$161,100 have been awarded.

To be eligible for the scholarships, students must be majoring in agricultural business/economics at UNL or agribusiness or ag production systems at NCTA. Eligibility is restricted to sons or daughters of a parent or legal guardian who has been an active member, director, or employee for at least the prior three years of a cooperative which has been a member in good standing of the Council for at least five years. Other criteria are used by UNL and NCTA.

The six recipients of \$2,500 scholarships at UNL are:

- Eric Klitz, son of John & Alice Klitz of West Point, will be a freshman majoring in agribusiness. The Klitz's are members of Central Valley Ag Co-op in York.
- Andrew Bader, son of Gary & Dolores Bader of Gresham, will be a junior majoring in agribusiness. The Bader's are members of Central Valley Ag Co-op in York and Farmers Co-op in Dorchester.
- Erika Harms, daughter of Randy & Karla Harms of Glenvil, will be a junior majoring in agribusiness. The Harms' are members of Fairfield N/S Co-op Fertilizer and Cooperative Producers Inc in Hastings.
- ♦ Kyle Heithoff, son of Stan & Dorothy Heithoff of Elgin, will be a sophomore majoring in agribusiness. The Heithoff's are members of Central Valley Ag Co-op in York.
- ♦ Tyler Marotz, son of Erin & Nancy Marotz of Mead, will be a junior majoring in agribusiness. The Marotz's are members of Frontier Co-op Co in Brainard.
