Building for the Future of Nebraska's Agricultural Cooperatives

The Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation has been established by the Nebraska Cooperative Council for the purpose of enhancing the educational offerings to the cooperative and agribusiness industry. Education has always been one of the core values of the cooperative movement in Nebraska.

S pecific allowable uses of Foundation funds are:

- **Scholarship programs** for high school graduates to continue their education at Nebraska post-secondary institutions that provide agribusiness management programs.
- Continuing education programs for local cooperative directors and employees.
- Youth education programs for projects such as curriculum development or co-op day camps.
- Travel/study scholarships for cooperative employees to attend programs such as the Graduate Institute of Cooperative Leadership or educational events of the National Council of Farmer Cooperatives.
- Intern scholarships to allow students to explore cooperative career opportunities and conduct research projects for cooperatives.
- Special educational projects that would enhance the cooperative movement in the state. An example would be the Cooperative Recruitment Project that we conducted or the Director Certification Program video update project.



2007/08 FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS

- The Foundation continues to increase the endowment fund for the Scholarship Program in Honor of Michael S. Turner.
- To date we have received contributions of \$195, 751.38 and grants totaling \$74,312.74.
- The Foundation and Council are working together with USDA and the University of Nebraska to revise and distribute a new curriculum guide for cooperative education. This curriculum will be provided to all high school and post-secondary ag programs.
- The Foundation is seeking grant funds to develop a "Nebraska" section for the curriculum guide as well as produce a video explaining the cooperative business model.

2007/08 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation awarded eight scholarships totaling \$6,000 for the 2008/09 academic year to students at the University of Nebraska - Lincoln (UNL) College of Agricultural Sciences & Natural Resources, the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture (NCTA) at Curtis, and Chadron State College.

The scholarship program was initiated for the 1993/94 academic year with voluntary contribution funding from cooperatives which are members of the Council. Since the program's inception, 123 scholarships totaling \$91,550 have been awarded.

To be eligible for the scholarships, students must be majoring in agricultural business/economics at UNL; business/management or ag production systems with the business option at NCTA; or a major or minor in agribusiness at Chadron State College. Eligibility is restricted to sons or daughters of a parent or legal quardian who has been an active member, director, or employee for at least the prior three years of a cooperative which has been a member in good standing of the Council for at least five years. Other criteria are used by UNL, NCTA, and Chadron State College in selecting recipients.

Scholarship Recipients for the 2008/09 Academic Year

The six recipients of \$800 scholarships at UNL include one incoming student and five upperclass students. They are:

Co-op in Gothenburg.


