# Building for the Future of Nebraska's Agricultural Cooperatives

The Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation is organized as a 501(c)(3) under the Internal Revenue Code. It has been established by the Nebraska Cooperative Council for the purpose of enhancing the educational offerings to the cooperative and agribusiness industry. Education has always been one of the core values of the cooperative movement in Nebraska.

Specific allowable uses of Foundation funds are:

- Scholarship programs for college students to continue their education at Nebraska post-secondary institutions that provide agribusiness management programs.
- Continuing education programs for local cooperative directors and employees.
- Youth education programs for projects such as curriculum development or co-op day camps.
- Travel/study scholarships for cooperative employees to attend programs such as the Graduate Institute of Cooperative Leadership or educational events of the National Council of Farmer Cooperatives.
- Intern scholarships to allow students to explore cooperative career opportunities and conduct research projects for cooperatives.
- Special educational projects that would enhance the cooperative movement in the state.



## 2011/12 FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS

The Foundation continues to seek new avenues to inform stakeholders about the value of the cooperative business model. Since 2001:

- The Foundation has provided 88 scholarships totaling \$70,150 to highly qualified ag students, and our research shows that 78% of past recipients are involved in ag careers and 76% of past recipients live in Nebraska.
- The Foundation has received over \$93,500 in grant funds that have been used to further cooperative education for youth. Examples of projects we have conducted are the FFA Cooperative Speaking Contest, cooperative curriculum update, cooperative videos, and college presentations focusing on the cooperative business model.

### SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation awarded 5 scholarships totaling \$5,000 for the 2012/13 academic year to students at the University of Nebraska - Lincoln (UNL) College of Agricultural Sciences & Natural Resources. While a scholarship was also offered at both Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture (NCTA) at Curtis and Chadron State College (CSC), there were no eligible applicants at either.

The scholarship program was initiated in the 1993/94 academic year with voluntary contribution funding from cooperatives which are members of the Council. Since the program's inception, 149 scholarships totaling \$114,700 have been awarded.

To be eligible for the scholarships, students must be majoring in agricultural business/economics at UNL; agribusiness or ag production systems at NCTA; or have a major or minor in agribusiness at CSC. Eligibility is restricted to sons or daughters of a parent or legal guardian who has been an active member, director, or employee for at least the prior three years of a cooperative which has been a member in good standing of the Council for at least five years. Other criteria are used by UNL, NCTA, and CSC in selecting recipients.
