# Building for the Future of Nebraska's Agricultural Cooperatives

The Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation has been established by the Nebraska Cooperative Council for the purpose of enhancing the educational offerings to the cooperative and agribusiness industry. Education has always been one of the core values of the cooperative movement in Nebraska.

Specific allowable uses of Foundation funds are:

- Scholarship programs for high school graduates to continue their education at Nebraska post-secondary institutions that provide agribusiness management programs.
- Continuing education programs for local cooperative directors and employees.
- Youth education programs for projects such as curriculum development or cooperative day camps.
- Travel/study scholarships for cooperative employees to attend programs such as the Graduate Institute of Cooperative Leadership (GICL) or educational events of the National Council of Farmer Cooperatives (NCFC).
- Intern scholarships to allow students to explore cooperative career opportunities and conduct research projects for cooperatives.
- Special educational projects that would enhance the cooperative movement in the state. An example would be the Cooperative Recruitment Project that we conducted or the Director Certification Program video update project.



# 2003/04 FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS

- The Foundation completed the endowment fund for the Scholarship Program in Honor of Michael S.
   Turner. To date we have generated contributions of \$178,748.23 for the scholarship fund.
- The Foundation obtained a grant from the CHS Foundation to update a video used in the Council's Director Certification Program.
- The Foundation has submitted several proposals to regional cooperatives for funding to improve and update current Council educational programs.

#### 2004/05 SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

The Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation awarded seven scholarships totaling \$5,200 for the 2004/05 academic year to students at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) College of Agricultural Sciences & Natural Resources, the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture (NCTA) at Curtis, and Chadron State College.

The scholarship program was initiated for the 1993/94 academic year with funding from voluntary contributions from cooperatives which are members of the Council. Since the program's inception, 93 scholarships totaling \$68,550 have been awarded.

To be eligible for the scholarships, students must express an interest in or be majoring in agricultural business/economics at UNL; or business/management or ag production systems with the business option at NCTA; or agribusiness at Chadron State College. Eligibility is restricted to sons/daughters of a parent/legal guardian who has been an active member, director, or employee for at least the prior three years of a cooperative which has been a member in good standing of the Council for at least five years. Other criteria are used by UNL, NCTA, and Chadron State in selecting recipients.

The five recipients of \$800 scholarships at UNL include one incoming student and four upperclass students. They are:



Janae Althouse, daughter of Raymond & Judy Althouse of Eagle. Janae will be an incoming student at UNL and plans to major in Agribusiness/Leadership & Communication. The Althouses are members of Midwest Farmers Co-op in Elmwood.

Christopher Krueger, son of Michael & Miriam Krueger of Pierce. Christopher will be a junior at UNL majoring in Agribusiness with a minor in Agronomy. The Kruegers are members of the Battle Creek Farmers Co-op N/S.



Erín Mecklem, daughter of David & Barbara Mecklem of Lyman. Erin will be a junior at UNL majoring in Agricultural Economics. The Mecklems are members of Panhandle Co-op Association in Scottsbluff.



Tiffany Minnick, daughter of Scott & Mary Minnick of Riverton. Tiffany will be a senior at UNL majoring in Agricultural Business. The Minnicks are members of Midland Coop in Funk.

Communications. The Spohns are members of Farmers Union Co-op Co. in Friend and Farmers Co-op in Dorchester.






The recipient of a \$600 scholarship at NCTA is:


