# Building for the Future of Nebraska's Agricultural Cooperatives

The Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation is organized as a 501(c)(3) under the Internal Revenue Code. It has been established by the Nebraska Cooperative Council for the purpose of enhancing the educational offerings for the cooperative industry.

Specific allowable uses of Foundation funds are:

- Scholarship programs for college students to continue their education at Nebraska post-secondary institutions that provide agribusiness management programs.
- Continuing education programs for local cooperative directors and employees.
- Youth education programs for projects such as curriculum development or co-op day camps.
- Travel/study scholarships for cooperative employees to attend programs such as the Graduate Institute of Cooperative Leadership or other cooperative educational events.
- Intern scholarships to allow students to explore cooperative career opportunities and conduct research projects for cooperatives.
- Special educational projects that would enhance the cooperative movement in the state.



#### 2017/18 FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS

- In partnership with the CHS Foundation, the NCC Education Foundation and the Council provided information on cooperatives to 328 high school and college students through presentations and speaking contests.
- Through our curriculum projects we indirectly reach an additional 8,000 students through the Nebraska FFA.
- For the 2018/19 academic year, the Foundation provided 8 scholar-ships totaling \$19,000 to students at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture Curtis.

#### SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation awarded 8 scholarships totaling \$19,000 for the 2018/19 academic year to students at the University of Nebraska - Lincoln (UNL) College of Agricultural Sciences & Natural Resources and the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture (NCTA) at Curtis.

The scholarship program was initiated in the 1993/94 academic year with voluntary contribution funding from cooperatives which are members of the Council. Since the program's inception, 189 scholarships totaling \$199,100 have been awarded.

To be eligible for the scholarships, students must be majoring in agribusiness or agricultural economics at UNL and agribusiness or ag production systems at NCTA.
